



GLASS

Rinse clean and remove caps and lids. Labels and rings may be left on.

INCLUDE: Ceramics, coffee mugs, plates, milk bottles, green, amber, red, blue, brown and clear empty bottles, jars, Pyrex and window glass (glass only)

DO NOT INCLUDE: Light bulbs, mirrors, caps and lids which all go to landfill.

HOW TO BUNDLE: Place in recycle bin or other container.



NORTH SHORE PAPER MIX

INCLUDE: Computer print out paper including green and white lined computer paper, white and colored ledger paper, envelopes with or without windows, FAX paper, “carbonless” carbon paper, slick or

glossy paper (includes soda and beer cartons), manila folders, tab cards, office or direct mail, staples and paper clipped paper, chipboard (cereal and cracker boxes, shoe boxes, etc.), unwanted mail, mixed office papers, note paper, copy paper, drawing paper and hard cover books with covers removed.

DO NOT INCLUDE: Carbon paper, self-sealing envelopes, mylar, tyvek, foil paper, metal, blue prints, plastic coated paper, tissue, napkins, paper cups, paper plates, wax cardboard, and paper ream wrappers.

HOW TO BUNDLE: Place in paper or plastic bag or in a box.

NO FOOD OR OTHER TRASH TO BE MIXED IN WITH PAPER INCLUDING PLASTIC WRAP AND FOIL.

YARD & CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS WILL NOT BE PICKED UP WITH HOUSEHOLD TRASH



Recycling Guidelines





MAGAZINES & NEWSPAPERS

INCLUDE: All magazines, all clean dry newspapers, newspaper inserts, catalogs, telephone books, brown paper bags and paperback books.

DO NOT INCLUDE: Waxed papers

HOW TO BUNDLE: Place in either a plastic or paper bag



CARDBOARD

INCLUDE: All clean dry, cardboard with brown corrugated in the middle.

DO NOT INCLUDE: Wax coated cardboard or colors that are not brown in the middle.

HOW TO BUNDLE: Flatten and can be tied with string or cord.



CANS

INCLUDE: All aluminum and tin (steel) cans used for food or beverage. Labels are okay to leave on. **Cans must be rinsed clean and be no larger than one gallon in size.**

DO NOT INCLUDE: White and yellow coated cans or cans with plastic or paper parts, empty aerosol cans aluminum trays and foil. These go to the landfill.

HOW TO BUNDLE: Place in recycling bin or container. May be flattened.



PLASTICS

INCLUDE: #1 PETE: These have a seam down the side and a #1 symbol on the bottom of the container such as clear or colored soda bottles, salad dressings and other jars. **CAPS REMOVED AND SEPARATE FROM #2 HDPE.**



INCLUDE: #2 HDPE: Containers with narrow necks and a #2 symbol on the bottom such as milk, water, juice, dishwasher liquid and detergent containers

DO NOT INCLUDE: Any containers that indicate #2 compatible. Any containers from automotive products such as oil and antifreeze. Any containers where the opening is the same or larger than the base regardless of the symbol shown.

HOW TO BUNDLE: #2 HDPE: String loosely together with twine.

HOW TO BUNDLE: #1 PETE: Place in recycling bin or other container.

NOTE: IT IS IMPORTANT THAT YOU RINSE CLEAN AND DRAIN COMPLETELY ALL PLASTIC THAT IS TO BE RECYCLED. BE SURE TO REMOVE METAL OR PLASTIC CAPS.
